Major story of the week according to web news sites: KFC released their new double down burger. Which is arguably not a burger because it has no buns, it is just bacon and cheese sandwiched between to pieces of chicken – and it comes jam packed with 540 calories and 32 grams of fat. The reaction to this burger has been incredible, with video reviews, analyses and graphic documentation of the Double Down leaking onto YouTube and other media. The effect of all learning how bad these burger babies are and their lack of nutritional value is acting as a major stimulant for its sales. KFC in NZ apparently has sold 37,000 burgers so far this week.

Incredibly or predictably, by letting us know how bad it is has had the effect of challenging people to eat one, as the stakes of temptation are raised. I have Amazingly so many of my conversations I've had this week have started with, "have you had one yet?" It was the opening conversation starter at a gathering of youth pastors on Thursday morning ,part of a catch-up with a young person on Thursday afternoon and the opening statement at the small group I attended on Thursday night. It just seems to be so human nature, we're told "no" and we can't help ourselves.

This got me thinking about that question: "Have you had one yet?" – how many other "firsts" do you think that question could apply to in our culture. The first is never made a big deal of – more like a dare, a bit of a joke – hardly an addiction. But the first usually leads to the 2nd, 3rd, 4th...and then suddenly stuff is a big deal. And we are wanting a lot of something that is really bad for us – really costly.

Parents, it is safer if you are aware of some of the "firsts" your kids might be wanting to try....likely the Double Down is the least of our problems. And, trust me....with most other things ...the first is a REAL big deal.
