Thanks to those of you who have contacted us in regards to billeting families from Christchurch, however we are not coordinating billets at this point in time. The following organization does however need assistance with billets, so for those of you who phoned us, this could be an area you could respond to:

-Heart Children NZ have many families in need of assistance due to the earthquake. They are currently housing Heart Children families from Christchurch at a camp in Cleveland.

It is anticipated that families will stay there for two weeks while billets are found. They are anticipating that up to 400 families may be in need of this assistance.
